## What is it?



## Who does it apply to?

It applies to all organisations - public and private, that handle, store or process personal data.

The Law sets out clear compliance requirements surrounding the use of personal data.

## What is personal data?

Information relating to an identified or identifiable individual

## The consequences of non-compliance

Fines of up to £10,000,000

## The risk of compensation claims

Notifying the supervisory authorities if there is a breach

Data breaches must be reported to the supervisory authority within

**72 hours**



## Subject Access Requests

Personal data should be provided to the data subject within one month

## Individual rights include



- Right to information
- Right of access
- Right to data portability
- Right to rectification
- Right to erasure
- Right to restrict processing

## Consent

Must be freely given, informed, explicit

Opt in



Not opt out
